

Freedom Academy Parent Policy

Freedom Academy provides, under the NCLB federal law (20U.S.C. section 6318 (a) (2)), a policy to govern activities to include parent involvement in the following areas.

- 1- Assemble a forum of teachers and parents to develop and review the annual CUSAP plan submitted to the state of Utah. The LEA will ask parents who are new and those who have been at Freedom Academy for more than one year. Parents will be asked to review last years CUSAP, this year's rough draft and make suggestions of needs that see. These items will be discussed in a review meeting.
- 2- Annual notice will be sent to the parents of the school academic successes. State AYP reports will be presented on line and in the local newspaper. A parent committee from the PTO will be asked to do a review and make formal suggestions.
- 3- Welcome parents to attend school board meetings and entertain questions from the parents. Make available to parents the translation of any and all communications from the school involving academic and non-academic activities. Support and maintain a school web-site for dispensing and accepting information.
- 4- Coordinate and integrate a Parent-Teacher Organization to provide for: dissemination of school information; supporting school policies; conducting fund raising projects; conducting educational forums such as Book Fairs; student character building activities such as Red Ribbon week.
- 5- Freedom Academy will hold an annual Back to School night and Curriculum night to inform parents of school policies, curriculum procedures and expectations of students and parents. Parents will ask to volunteer time in the classroom to aid in the Accelerated Reading program with students.
- 6- Freedom Academy does conduct each spring, an annual evaluation of the effectiveness of parental involvement with the assistance of the PTO. Plans are written to incorporate successful activities for the next year.
- 7- Freedom Academy does require and welcome parents to volunteer forty hours each year to help with academic and non-academic activities during and after school hours.
