

Freedom Academy School-Parent Compact

Federal Law (20 U.S.C. page6318(b), (c), (e)) requires that each school served under Title I shall jointly develop with, distribute to, parents of participating children a written parental involvement policy, agreed on by such parents, that shall describe the means for carrying out the following requirements:

- 1- Freedom Academy will conduct a Parent Back-to-School evening on two (2) separate nights to introduce programs available to all students at FA, and programs available to struggling students. Freedom Academy administration will make appointments and be available to parents who are unable to attend these meetings. Information will also be posted on the school web page and sent home in the Freedom Flyer communication folder.
- 2- In the Fall of each year, a parent and teacher committee will be formed to review the school-wide plan of the previous year, evaluate academic needs and plan for the integration of federal funds to improve the needed areas. In the Spring of each year the school along with the PTO will assemble a committee to evaluate the effectiveness of the recent years' parent involvement policy.
- 3- Curriculum Nights will be held on tow (2) separate evenings. Individual teachers will explain the adopted school curriculum with he instruction, and assessment measures used to obtain student progress. This information will also be posted on the school web page.
- 4- Freedom Academy will offer to parents a copy of the State Core requirements for each grade level. Explanations will be given by the administration when asked. FA will post the USOE web-site for parents to access for more information. Notice will be posted in the Freedom Flyer of the availability of such information.
- 5- Parents will be provided with materials (books, rubrics, progress reports, translations, etc.) to help at home with student school assignments. By creating this partnership both parties become equally responsible for student improvement.

Back to School night and Curriculum night will provide parents with an overview of requirements and suggestions for parental support of students. Individual training for specific curriculum will be provided upon request from teachers.

- 6- Upon request of parents, the administration and teachers will provide reasonable support to parents for any and all school related activities, academic and non-academic. These include communication translations, academic translators, school web-site postings.

- 7- Information of school and parent programs, meetings and other activities will be sent home bi-monthly in communication folder to each family in the FA community. Parents may also access the school web-page.
